- O Patrick: All complaints should go through the Google form. We then allocate it to the right group to handle.
- Shrey: If the Judiciary has the final authority, does that mean we can make changes to the Constitution?
  - O Patrick: No, unless there is a clause in the Constitution that needs to be clarified. Otherwise changes in Constitution must go through Council.
- Shrey: Under the clause of communication of DoS, should we have a liaison with DoS in the case of illegal activities etc?
  - O Patrick: Chief Justice should do it. All Justices have the **constitutional obligation** to report any illegal matters.
- Shrey: We need to publicize our functions to the student body.
  - O Patrick: Do we need to hold an event?
  - O Shrey: I think written would be enough.
  - O Adam: When we publicize the procedures, we can include this information inside as well.
  - O Shrey: We might want to have a lunch table to let students know what we are doing.
  - O Elson: We should publish what we had done today to the student body.
- Adam: Do we want to announce the Chief Justice on Facebook tonight?
  - O Shrey: It will come out in the minutes and the email.
  - O Patrick: I do not think it is necessary.
- Elson: When we put up the minutes up, should we post on Facebook?
  - O Adam: I will let Council know. Maybe admin privileges to Facebook group.
- Patrick: Also, we need to issue a report every month re: constitutionality of the Council's actions.
  - O Adam: We can discuss the monthly report during our monthly meetings.
- Shrey: If a complaint arrives, what is our response time?
  - O Sharlene: What if there are many complaints coming very quickly?
  - O Patrick: We can set up an emergency meeting to respond to that.
  - O Sharlene: Can we respond to straightforward complaints online?
  - O Adam: Online votes do not count.

	O Patrick: I can write an opinion and we can vote on Monday meetings.  • What do we do in suits re: decisions?  O If we cannot come to a unanimous consensus, we will postpone the verdict until we can meet on Monday with a written opinion from the Chief Justice.
